

Rules and regulations for the design competition for the silver collector coin for the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad in Paris

1. Purpose of the design competition

The purpose of the design competition for the silver collector coin for the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad in Paris is to find a design that is appropriate for the minting of the coin.

2. Technical specifications of the coin design

2.1. The specifications for the coin are attached in Appendix 1 of these rules and regulations.

2.2. The requirements for the submission of designs are:

- 1) the design must be submitted in black and white, and if necessary as a colour printing version, on a sheet of A4 in portrait format showing the upper and lower surfaces in the scales of 1:1 and 4:1;
 - 2) if the design uses reflective surfaces or matt areas, these should be shown separately;
 - 3) the design must show both the obverse and the reverse;
 - 4) the obverse of the coin must bear the great coat of arms of Estonia, the words "Eesti Vabariik" and the year 2024;
 - 5) the national coat of arms in the design must adhere to the legally set reference standard for the national coat of arms;
 - 6) the reverse of the coin must show the nominal value of the coin with the symbol for the euro 10 € (see Appendix 2 Specification for the Euro Symbol), and the logo of the Estonian Olympic Committee (see Appendix 3);
 - 7) letters and numbers must be at least 2 mm in size;
 - 8) the proportions of the logo of the Estonian Olympic Committee in the design must allow the word "Estonia" on the logo to be at least 1 mm high;
 - 9) in addition to the black and white designs, coloured designs and three-dimensional drawings to the same scales may be submitted;
 - 10) the design may be submitted as a physical model in the scale 4:1, which should clearly show separately the reflective surfaces and matt areas if they are used in the design.
- 2.3. The design of the coin may not use any symbols protected by intellectual property rights held by the International Olympic Committee or the organising committee for the Olympic games in Paris in 2024.
- 2.4. Designs that do not conform to the technical or other terms and conditions of the design competition will be neither considered nor assessed.

3. General terms and conditions of the competition

3.1. Any person wishing to participate in the design competition may do so individually or in a group.

3.2. Designers may submit one or more designs for the coin. Variations on a single design are not considered separate designs.

3.3. The deadline for the submission of designs is 10 March 2023 at 12.00. Designs submitted after the deadline will not be entered in the competition.

3.4. Designs should be submitted by the deadline to: Mündikonkurss (Pariisi suveolümpiamängud), Eesti Pank, Estonia pst 13, 15095 Tallinn.

3.5. Each design must be submitted on a separate page and given a one-word title. Multiple designs should each have separate keywords. Each design must be accompanied by a sealed envelope containing the designer's details: name, address, telephone number and email address, and the registry number if the designer is a FIE. The sealed envelope may only be marked with the same keyword as the design.

- 3.6. Participants in the competition must confirm that the design submitted is an original work and does not breach the intellectual property rights of any other party.
- 3.7. The winner of the coin design competition will be paid 2500 (two thousand five hundred) euros as a prize within ten calendar days after the commemorative coins have been minted and issued. The designer of the second-placed design will get 1500 (one thousand five hundred) euros and the designer of the third-placed design will get 1000 (one thousand) euros ten calendar days after signing the contract detailed in point 3.9.
- 3.8. All legally required taxes and payments will be deducted by Eesti Pank from the amounts listed in point 3.7.
- 3.9. The competition winners and the second and third placed entrants will sign a contract granting all the proprietary rights of the design to Eesti Pank, giving exclusive permission to exercise the licensed personal proprietary rights of the designer insofar as this is necessary for the minting and issuing the coin and making related products, and granting Eesti Pank the right to sub-license the rights so acquired throughout the world without limit of time. The contract will be signed once the results of the competition have been approved by the Supervisory Board of Eesti Pank, except in the case where no designs chosen by the panel are submitted to the Supervisory Board under point 4.4, and this must be done before the prize can be paid to the designer.
- 3.10. The panel judging the competition has the right to propose additions to the winning design or changes to its proportions and composition.
- 3.11. The minter of the coin has the right to propose additions to the winning design or changes to its proportions, if the technical requirements of minting make it necessary.
- 3.12. Eesti Pank has the right to change the nominal value of the design.
- 3.13. The winning designer or group of designers will make the changes to the design proposed by the panel or the minter, or Eesti Pank in the case of the nominal value, for no additional fee and will then present the amended design to Eesti Pank within ten calendar days of receiving the proposal.
- 3.14. If the winning designer or group of designers does not immediately make the changes proposed by the panel or the minter to the design for any reason, and refuses to grant Eesti Pank or a third party nominated by Eesti Pank the right to make such changes, then Eesti Pank will have the right to mint the coin using the second-placed design in the competition. In this case the winning designer will not receive any payment and no contract will be signed with them or any already signed contract will be terminated.
- 3.15. The winning designer or group of designers will make or have made a plaster or other three-dimensional model of the coin for minting within 14 (fourteen) calendar days of signing the contract detailed in point 3.9. The recommended diameter of the plaster model is 200mm, the maximum thickness is 2.5mm, and the minimum is 0.4mm. The outside edge of the model must be marked with a fine line. The height of narrower design elements such as ornamental lines should be calculated as $0.2 \times$ the width of the element. The angle of the relief must be greater than 30° . Where needed, the winning designer or group of designers will consult Eesti Pank during the preparations for minting and visit the mint to assess the stages of the preparations.
- 3.16. The winning designer or group of designers will sign a separate service contract for preparing the plaster model or the plaster and 3D models and for visiting the mint. Eesti Pank will pay the costs for making the plaster or other three-dimensional model, against documentary proof of expenses, as agreed in the service contract. If the designer or group of designers needs to visit the minter, Eesti Pank will pay the travel and accommodation costs.
- 3.17. All the costs of participating in the design competition will be covered by the participants.
- 3.18. Designs submitted for the competition will not be returned.
- 3.19. Eesti Pank will announce the names of the designers of the designs chosen in the competition.
- 3.20. Participants submitting designs grant Eesti Pank the right to collect and process their personal data to identify the designers of the three best designs and to sign a contract with them, and to archive them in the museum in the public interest. The personal data of the competition entrants are handled in accordance with the general regulation EU 2016/679 and the Personal Data Protection Act.

- 3.21. Eesti Pank has the right to change the conditions of the design competition before the deadline stated in clause 3.3 above, and changes to the conditions will be announced in the same form as these rules and regulations.
- 3.22. Participants submitting designs for coins to the competition are considered to have accepted the conditions for entry of the competition.

4. Assessment of the designs submitted to the design competition

- 4.1. The designs and whether they conform with the rules is assessed by a panel convened by Eesti Pank.
- 4.2. The panel and the organiser of the competition have the right to reject a design that is not in full compliance with any one or other condition of the competition, even after the assessment of the designs.
- 4.3. The panel is entitled to declare that none of the submitted designs has won the competition and to declare the competition unsuccessful.
- 4.4. The three best designs chosen by the panel from among those submitted to the competition will be sent with proposals by the panel to the Supervisory Board of Eesti Pank to confirm the design of the coin. If the panel chooses only the winning design in accordance with point 4.5, then only the winning design is sent to the Supervisory Board, and if the panel does not choose a winning design, then no designs are sent to the Supervisory Board and it is deemed that no design has been found by the competition.
- 4.5. The panel has the right to decide not to choose the three best works and to leave any place unselected when choosing the three best works, and if the panel chooses at least one design then the competition is not deemed unsuccessful and the work or works chosen are paid the prizes as set out in point 3.7.
- 4.6. The results of the competition will be announced by 1 June 2023 at the latest.

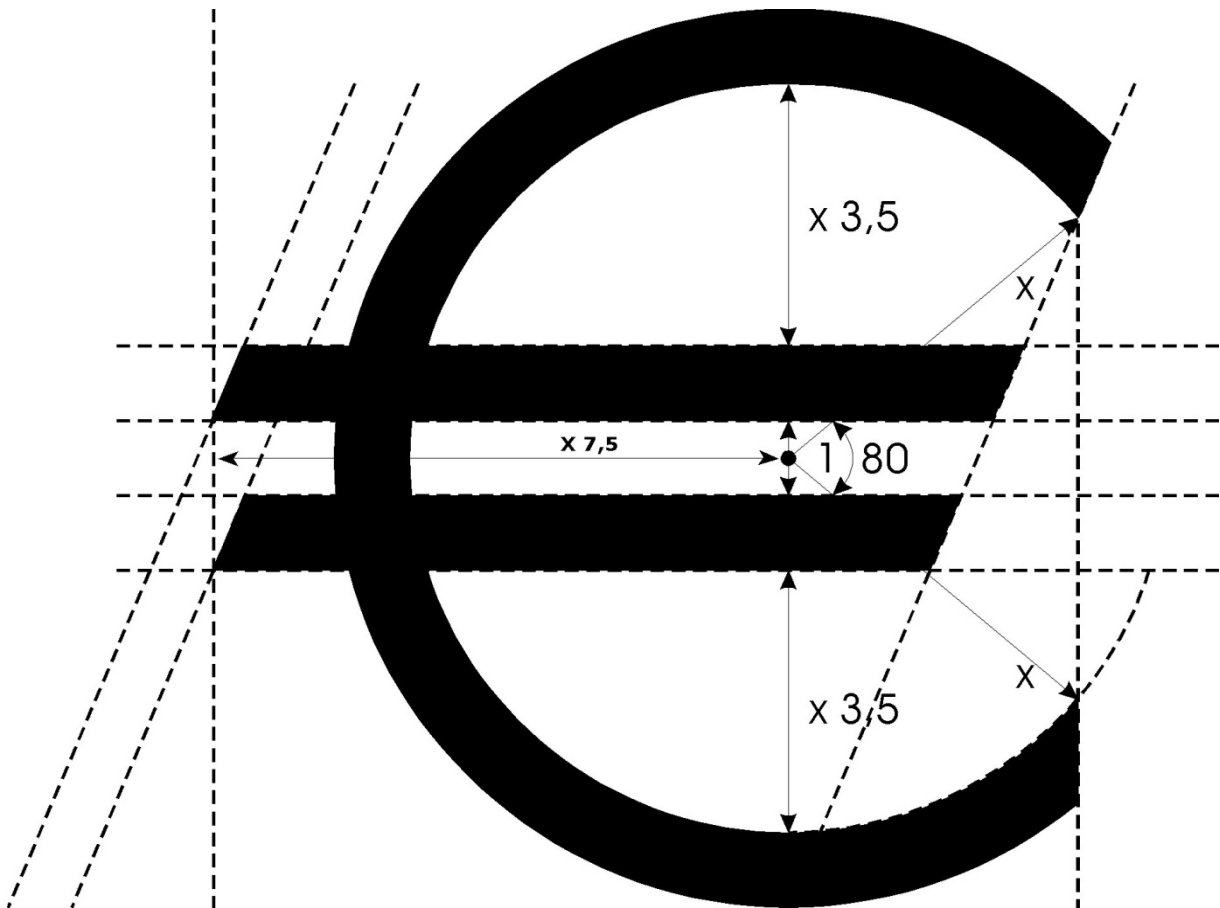

Rules of procedure of the panel for the design competition for the collector coin for the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad in Paris

1. Composition of the design competition panel

1.1. The designs and whether they conform with the rules is assessed by a panel convened by Eesti Pank and composed of:

A member of the Executive Board of Eesti Pank as Chair of the panel
A member of the Supervisory Board of Eesti Pank
A member of the Cash and Infrastructure Department of Eesti Pank
A member of the General Secretariat of Eesti Pank
A representative of the Estonian Artists' Association
A representative of the Estonian Academy of Arts
A representative of the Faculty of Humanities (Institute of History), University of Tartu
A representative of the Estonian Sculptors' Union
Two representatives of the Estonian Olympic Committee

1.2. Members of the Supervisory and Executive Boards and employees of Eesti Pank, and representatives of the Estonian Olympic Committee will not be remunerated for their work on the panel. Other panel members are remunerated under authorisation agreements granting each panel member 100 (one hundred) euros, from which all legally required taxes and payments are deducted. The remuneration is paid on the condition that the panel member assesses the designs within the deadlines set out in this rules of procedure.

2. Assessment of the designs submitted to the design competition

2.1. Panel members can examine the designs at least 24 hours before the agreed time when the decision will be made. If the meeting of the panel is only held remotely, the panel members will be sent electronically for consideration the designs submitted to the competition as soon as possible before the time agreed for the decision, and if possible 24 hours before.

2.2. Each panel member is entitled to express their opinion on all the designs submitted to the design competition if the meeting is held in person. If the meeting of the panel is only held remotely, Eesti Pank has the right to apply a system where each panel member considers the designs independently in advance of the time scheduled for the meeting, chooses the five best from among them, and submits the numbers or key words of those five works by email to Eesti Pank by a certain deadline. The designs chosen by the panel members form the preliminary list of designs, and the whole panel is informed by email of this list as soon as possible in advance of the meeting.

2.3. The panel will decide during its meeting on the order the designs will be assessed in and how they will be assessed. The Chair of the panel will decide the order in which opinions may be expressed. If the meeting of the panel is only held remotely, only the preliminary list of designs noted in point 2.2. of these rules will be discussed and assessed at the meeting. If needed, Eesti Pank has the right to organise more than one remotely held meeting.

2.4. Panel members assess the coin designs by each awarding points from 3 to 1 to the three designs they like the most for each coin, unless the panel has previously decided by consensus, given the circumstances and level of the competition, to use a different method for assessing the designs.

- 2.5. The points given to each design are added up and it is noted which three designs received the most points, if the panel has not previously changed the method of assessment or decided to apply point 2.8. If two or more designs receive the same number of points, they will be ranked in order of which received the highest number of high scores, starting with the number of 3-point awards that each received. If all the scores are equal, there will be a repeat vote between the designs that received the same points. If the votes remain equal after this, the Chair of the panel will have the casting vote.
- 2.6. The panel is quorate if more than half of all the members, including the Chair, attend the meeting.
- 2.7. The panel is entitled to declare that none of the submitted designs has won the competition and to declare the competition unsuccessful.
- 2.8. The panel has the right to decide not to choose the three best works and to leave any place unselected when choosing the three best works.
- 2.9. The panel has the right to propose additions to the designs or changes to their proportions, but does not have the right to change the whole design.
- 2.10. The panel will take its decision on the designs to be submitted to the Supervisory Board of Eesti Pank and the proposal for the winning design by 26 April 2023 at the latest.
- 2.11. The results of the design competition will be published after the meeting of the Supervisory Board, and by 1 June 2023 at the latest.
- 2.12. Envelopes containing the names and details of the designers will be opened after the assessment, but only the envelopes for the three designs chosen by the panel.
- 2.13. Minutes are taken of the meetings of the panel. The meetings of the panel will be minuted by a member of Cash and Infrastructure Department of Eesti Pank who is not a member of the panel. The minutes of the panel meeting will be signed by the Chair of the panel and the person who took the minutes.
- 2.14. Issues not covered by these rules of procedure will be decided by the panel by consensus.
