Rules for the design competition for the collector coin for the Estonian delegation and athletes to the XXIII Olympic Winter Games in Pyeongchang

1. Purpose of the design competition

The purpose of the design competition for the collector coin for the Estonian delegation and athletes to the XXIII Olympic Winter Games in Pyeongchang is to find a design that is appropriate for the minting of the coin.

2. Conditions of the design competition

- 2.1. Designers may participate in the design competition individually or in a group.
- 2.2. Designers may submit one or more designs for the coin.
- 2.3. The deadline for the submission of designs is 10 March 2017 at 12.00. Designs submitted after the deadline will not be entered in the competition.
- 2.4. Designs should be submitted by the deadline in a sealed envelope to: Mündižürii, Eesti Pank, Estonia pst 13, 15095 Tallinn.
- 2.5. Each design must be submitted on a separate page and given a one-word title; if a designer submits multiple designs, each design must have a separate title. Each design must be accompanied by a sealed envelope containing the designer's details: name, address, telephone number and email address, bank account number, and the registry number if the designer is a FIE. The sealed envelope should be marked with the same keyword as the design.
- 2.6. Participants in the competition confirm by submitting the design that the design is original and does not breach the intellectual property rights of any other party.
- 2.7. The winner of the coin design competition will be paid 2000 (two thousand) euros as a prize within ten calendar days after the collector coins have been minted and issued. The designer of the second-placed design will get 700 (seven hundred) euros and the designer of the third-placed design will get 500 (five hundred) euros ten calendar days after signing the contract detailed in point 2.9.

- 2.8. All legally required taxes and payments will be deducted by Eesti Pank from the amounts listed in point 2.7.
- 2.9. The payments other than that to the winner will be made to the designers after the designer or group of designers has signed a contract granting all the proprietary rights of the design to Eesti Pank, giving irrevocable permission to exercise the personal proprietary rights of the designer insofar as this is necessary for the minting of the coin, and granting Eesti Pank the right to transfer the rights so acquired to third parties. Contracts will be signed once the results of the competition have been made known.
- 2.10. The panel judging the competition has the right to propose additions to the winning design or changes to its proportions and composition.
- 2.11. The minter of the coin has the right to propose additions to the winning design or changes to its proportions, if the technical requirements of minting make it necessary.
- 2.12. Eesti Pank has the right to change the nominal value of the design.
- 2.13. The winning designer or group of designers will make the changes to the design proposed by the panel or the minter, or Eesti Pank in the case of the nominal value, for no additional fee and will then present the amended design to Eesti Pank within ten calendar days of receiving the proposal.
- 2.14. The winning designer or group of designers will make or have made a plaster or other three-dimensional model of the coin for minting within 14 (fourteen) calendar days of signing the contract detailed in point 2.15. Where needed, the winning designer or group of designers will consult Eesti Pank during the preparations for minting and visit the mint to assess the various stages of the preparations.
- 2.15. The winning designer or group of designers will sign a service contract for preparing the plaster or other three-dimensional model and for visiting the mint. Eesti Pank will pay up to 800 (eight hundred) euros of costs for making the plaster or other three-dimensional model, against documentary proof of expenses.
- 2.16. If the designer or group of designers needs to visit the minter, Eesti Pank will pay the travel and accommodation costs.
- 2.17. All the costs of participating in the design competition will be covered by the participants.
- 2.18. Designs submitted for the competition will not be returned.

- 2.19. Eesti Pank will publish the winning design and the names of the designers of the second and third-placed designs.
- 2.20. Participants submitting designs for coins to the competition are considered to have accepted the conditions for entry of the competition.

3. Technical specifications of the design competition

- 3.1. The technical specifications for the collector coin are attached in Appendix 1 of these rules and regulations.
- 3.2. The requirements for the submission of designs are:
- the design must be submitted in black and white, and in colour if necessary, on an A4 page in two scales, 1:1 and 4:1, and raised or lowered parts must be identified; if the design uses reflective surfaces or matt areas, these should be shown separately;
- 2) the design must show both the obverse and the reverse;
- 3) the obverse of the coin must bear the great coat of arms of Estonia, the words "Eesti Vabariik" and the year 2018;
- 4) the reverse of the coin must show the nominal value of the coin with the symbol for the euro 10 € (see Appendix 2 Specification for the Euro Symbol), and the logo of the Estonian Olympic Committee (see Appendix 1);
- 5) letters and numbers should be at least 2 mm high;
- 6) when considering for the proportions of the logo of the Estonian Olympic Committee, it should be remembered that the word "Estonia" on the logo should be at least 1 mm high;
- 7) in addition to the black and white designs, coloured designs and threedimensional drawings to the same scales may be submitted.
- 3.3. The design of the coin may not use any symbols protected by intellectual property rights held by the International Olympic Committee of the organising committee for the Olympic games in Pyeongchang in 2018.

4. Assessment of the designs submitted to the design competition

- 4.1. The designs and whether they conform with the rules is assessed by a panel convened by Eesti Pank.
- 4.2. Designs that do not conform to the terms and conditions of the design competition will be neither considered nor assessed.

- 4.3. The panel is entitled to declare that none of the submitted designs has won the competition and to declare the competition unsuccessful.
- 4.4. The three best designs chosen by the panel from among the designs submitted to the competition will be sent with proposals by the panel to the Supervisory Board of Eesti Pank to confirm the design of the collector coin.
- 4.5. The results of the competition will be announced by 10 April 2017 at the latest.

2. Conditions for using the official logo of the Estonian Olympic Committee

- 2.1. The logo may not be modified in any way
- 2.2. The logo can be made larger or smaller but must retain its proportions.
- 2.3. The Olympic rings may not be placed above the flame or beside the flame.
- 2.4. The logo is surrounded by a protected area (see the illustration of the logo) which can be kept to a minimum, but the elements of the logo may not be combined with other illustrations or graphics.
- 2.5. The logo must be used together with the word "Estonia". The font of the text is AGaramond.
- 2.6. The logo may be used in a single colour.
